2.22 Sec. 8. LOCAL RETIREMENT FUND INVESTMENT AUTHORITIES STUDY.

A study group consisting of representatives from pension plans subject to Minnesota 2.23 Statutes, section 356A.06, subdivision 6 or 7, shall be convened by the State Auditor to 2.24 study investment-related provisions, authorities, and limitations under Minnesota Statutes, 2.25 chapter 356A, and related sections of other chapters. Administrative support for the study 2.26 group shall be provided by the State Auditor. The study group shall prepare a report to 2.27 include an assessment of the effectiveness of current statutory prescriptions, options for 2.28 change, and recommendations for consideration by the governor and the legislature during 2.29 the 2011 legislative session. The report will be provided no later than January 15, 2011, to 2.30 the executive director of the Legislative Commission on Pensions and Retirement, the 2.31 chair of the Senate State and Local Government Operations and Oversight Committee, 2.32 and the Chair of the House State and Local Government Operations Reform, Technology 2.33 2.34 and Elections Committee.
