1. HF 308 (Patton); SF 177 (Stokowski) - MSRS: MWCC Tradesmen Exclusion
L. Martin, commission staff, went over the memo, and explained an amendment.

Sen. Ogdahl moved approval of the amendment to HF 308, SF 177. Carried

Sen. Stokowski moved that HF 308; SF 177, as amended, be recommended to pass.

2. <u>HF 306 (Patton; SF 180 (Stokowski) - PERA Administrative Changes</u>
L. Martin went over the staff memo. Discussion followed. The commission requested clarification and further research on Sections 5, 9 and 13.

The bill was laid over. The commission staff was instructed to prepare further answers to the various problems and questions—questions as to whether certain provisions should be made applicable to the other funds.

3. <u>HF 852 (Reding) Firemen's and Police Relief Associations - other than</u> <u>First Class Cities</u>

The bill provides that all police officers and firefighters hired after the effective date of the act shall become members of the PERA P&F Fund.
