## HF 863 (Moe) - St. Paul Teachers Retirement Assn; post retirement adjustments and benefit modification

Lyle Farmer, Sec/Treas of the St. Paul Teachers Retirement Fund Assn., explained the bill.

Rep. Moe moved to amend HF 863 on page 3, strike lines 15 thru 25. Passed.

Sen. Stokowski advised the need of a "sunset" provision for a period of three years in the bill. The staff was directed to draft the amendment to put in a 3 year sunset period.

Rep. moved that HF 863 as amended be recommended to pass. Motion carried.

## HF 1192 (Patton); SF 1128 (Stokowski): Local Police and Salaried

Firefighters Relief Associations; Increase in Employee Contributions L. Martin went over the memo. The bill provides for a 2% of salary employee contribution increase, up from 6% to 8%, which can be spread over a period of more than one year. The bill is effective 1/1/80.

Rep. Patton moved to strike Section 3 from the Patton amendment. Rep. Patton Motion carried. moved the amendment.

The bill was laid over.
